Appendix 1 for your information only (this is not part of the admission requirements): Hasmonean's Religious Nature

The religious nature of the school is based unambiguously on the principles of Orthodox Judaism. At the core of those principles is a recognition that both the written and Oral Torah are Divine. The principles are enshrined in the Shulchan Aruch, the Code of Jewish Law, and its commentaries, which delineate the laws, customs and values of an Orthodox Jewish lifestyle.

It is the school's aim to educate boys to conduct themselves in strict adherence to the Orthodox Jewish lifestyle throughout their lives. In addition, it is the school's purpose to provide its students, dependent on their individual capabilities, with the knowledge and skills to enable them to take their place as responsible adults in modern Britain.

The School in particular places special value on:

- a. Motivating students to engage in continual Torah study*
- b. Derech Eretz – respect for others, both within the School community and in the outside world*
- c. Integrity in all aspects of behaviour*
